

Vienna

The city of Vienna is not only the capital of Austria, it is also the country's smallest province. But it is a city with a very special atmosphere as well, a city where one feels the lasting effects of a long, glorious past. Vienna is still considered to be the intellectual center of a former multi-ethnic country and is an open-minded, multi-faceted city.

Vienna is located at an important cross-road of traffic and business in the heart of Europe and is one of today's major economic centers. The city is also renowned around the world for its excellence in music. Famous composers such as Strauss, Schubert, Mozart, Beethoven, Brahms, Haydn, Stolz and many more are among Vienna's great personalities. The city has also attracted brilliant figures from the fields of literature and science: Ferdinand Raimund, Arthur Schnitzler, Sigmund Freud and many others have chosen Vienna as their home.

It is impossible to list all of the city's attractions such as museums, churches, palaces, noble residences and the like. Nevertheless, a few of the most outstanding sights must be mentioned, such as the Imperial Palace (Hofburg), the national library, the Albertina, the Spanish Riding School, which houses the famous Lipizzaner horse shows, the Belvedere palace, the Schönbrunn

the Emperor's summer residence - and St. Stephen's Cathedral, dominating the skyline of the city center. The city's Ringstrasse is an elegant boulevard, where one finds many important institutions: the State Opera House, the Museum of Art History and Natural History, Parliament, the Burgtheater, the Rathaus (City Hall) and the University of Vienna. Vienna is the headquarters of many international organizations and an important meeting point of East and West.

Clothing and Weather

At the end of August the weather in Vienna is usually mild and quite pleasant. During the day it is usually sunny and warm, while the evenings are somewhat cool this time of year.

Parking Facilities

The Austria Center has adequate underground pay parking facilities.

Working Languages

The working languages of the conference will be English, French and German. Simultaneous interpretation for these languages will be provided for the joint meetings and for the general assembly. Normal meetings of the commissions, working groups and symposia will not be interpreted.

Electricity

Electricity is supplied at 230 V.

Getting around in Vienna

Scholarship Fund

INSTRUCTIONS FOR APPLICANTS

All Member Organizations have the right to propose young scientists - max. 30 years of age - as candidates for the Annual EAAP Conference. Individuals who have already obtained a scholarship in the past may not re-apply for a period of three years. A maximum of two scholarships per country can be granted.

The candidate should inform the relevant Member Organization of his/her application as soon as possible after circulation of the **provisional program** of the Study Commissions.

Before the 1st of February 1997:

For each applicant, the EAAP Secretariat in Rome should receive from the Member Organization a letter announcing and supporting the candidacy of the applicant, along with:

- Name, address, fax and phone number, date of birth, official title or function, short description of the scientific work and main publications of the applicant.
- Name and address of the employing institution.
- This formal request should be accompanied by:
- Five copies of the full text of the paper which the applicant intends to present to the Study Commissions. The topic of the paper should, of course, be relevant to the Agenda of the Conference. The copies should be drafted in one of the Association's working languages (English, German or French) and not exceed five pages (including tables and references).
- A copy of the original abstract form, properly completed in accordance with instructions,
- The estimated round-trip travel costs (flight APEX / student economy class or 2nd class rail ticket) to and from the Conference venue,
- · Bank references of the applicant.

Before the 15th of February 1997 (deadline):

The applicant must send the original abstract form and two copies of the intended paper directly to the publisher.

The original abstract must be "camera ready". It will be printed as it is by the publisher in the Abstract Book. Consequently, it must be typed in accordance with the authors' instructions listed on the back of the original pre-printed forms available fro the EAAP Rome Secretariat, the publisher or the Organizing Committee.

By the 15th of April 1997:

The EAAP Rome Secretariat will inform the applicant as to the result of the examination of candidacy by the Board of Examiners.

At the same time, the applicants will be notified of the amount, conditions and uses of the scholarship (amount depends on the funds available).

By the end of July 1997:

Subject to the same conditions as all other authors of abstracts, the selected candidates will be informed by the responsible Commission President regarding the modalities of presentation.

Papers

In 1994 the system for submitting papers was simplified, in order to prepare for the publication of a new EAAP series "Abstract Books of the Annual Meetings".

All authors wishing to present papers in Vienna in 1997 in the framework of the EAAP Study Commissions are requested to submit the title and abstract of their presentation on the preprinted form; this can be found in the provisional program which will be distributed at the beginning of 1997. It is also available from the EAAP Rome Secretariat, the Austrian Organizing Committee or from the publisher (Wageningen Pers, P.O. Box 42, NL - 6700 AA Wageningen, The Netherlands).

The original abstract, plus two copies, must be sent to the publisher by all authors and the scholarship applicants before the 1st of March 1997.

Guidelines for the Preparation of Abstracts

Abstracts are required in one of EAAP's three working languages (English, German or French), as the author chooses.

The abstract should be as informative as possible and should contain the specific objectives, experimental methods and statistical analyses employed, together with a synthesis of the results and conclusions.

The title and the abstract must not exceed the space provided in the box on the front of the preprinted form, which allows for app. 230 words. Please note once again that the abstracts will be printed exactly as they are submitted. Hence, the guidelines on the back of the form must be complied with.

Authors who submit abstracts but fail to register for the Conference by May 31, 1997 run the risk of having their abstracts withdrawn from the book.

Length of the Papers

Invited papers should normally not exceed 8 pages, contributed papers should be no longer than 5 pages, summaries should be no longer than 1 page, including tables, diagrams and references. The guidelines for authors are included in the provisional program and are available from the offices listed in paragraph one.

Provision of full papers

Authors should bring 150 copies of papers (for normal meetings) to be given to the responsible Commission Secretariats (deposit after registration in the preparation rooms) and 250 copies (for general meetings) of papers for distribution in front of the lecture hall.

Data Bank

The EAAP Rome Secretariat intends to establish a central data bank of all papers presented at EAAP-sponsored events. The texts will be available by e-mail.

All authors who wish to participate in this initiative should provide a copy of their work on diskette to the EAAP Rome Secretariat. Only texts written according to the "Guidelines for Authors" will be included in the data bank (in order of their reference number listing in the Abstract Book).
