

IMPACT FACTOR

The journal impact factor is a measure of the frequency with which the “average article” in a journal has been cited in a particular year. The impact factor helps evaluate the journal’s relative importance. The ADC’s **2009** impact increased to **0.461**. We are very proud of it.

(Cites in 2009 to items published in 2004-2008, sum. 90/197; Calculation: Cites to recent items: Number of recent items = 0.461).

ADC impact factor steadily increased from 0.122 in 2003 to 0.443 in 2008.
