Croatian Dermatovenereological Society of CMA is one of these societies, contributing greatly to the continuing medical education programs with its official journal Acta Dermatovenerologica Croatica.

As vice-president of the AMSC and Council chairwoman of the AMSC journal Acta Medica Croatica, I am proud to announce a book dedicated to the 50-year glorius history of AMSC.

Also as Guest Editor of the same journal, we will publish a thematic issue dedicated on this occasion to allergic diseases today.

Dermatovenereologists give support to the jubilee by organizing symposia with international participation and continuing medical education courses with textbooks, as follows: Dermatovenereology in General Medicine, February 26, 2011; Chronic Venous Insufficiency – Sclerotherapy, April 9, 2011; and International Symposium: Bullous Dermatoses, October 28-29, 2011.
