Certainly, this also applies to the expected contributions to the international symposia to be organized and held at some of the incoming psychological conferences of the region, such as Alps-Adria Conference in Psychology, Ramiro and Zoran Bujas Days, or Psychology Days in Zadar.

As a final point, I wish to thank again greatly to all the authors and the reviewers of all the manuscripts submitted for publishing in each of the two previous volumes of the journal including the present one, as well as to all other persons, one way or another engaged in this work, for their valuable contribution and the generous support in completing any of the published issues of the Review of Psychology.

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
