



**Univ.Prof.Dr.h.c. Felix Unger**

Prof.Dr.Felix Unger was born on March 2, 1946 in Klagenfurt, Austria. In 1965, he started with his studies at the *Medical School* of the *University of Vienna* from which he graduated in 1971 with the title M.D. After receiving his degree, he started his career as the resident at the *Clinic for Cardiology* (*University of Vienna*). In 1972 he joined the II. Surgical Clinic of the University of Vienna. His work took him to the United States where in 1974 he spent seven months in additional research and training with Denton A.Cooley (Houston/Texas), Yukihiko Nose, (Cleveland/Ohio) and Dr. Willem Kolff (Salt lake City/Utah). Returning to Europe, he continued his training in surgery. In 1978 he became Assistant professor of Surgery at the University of Vienna and Associate of the University Clinic for Surgery at Innsbruck University. In 1983 he became Professor of Surgery. From 1985 - 2011 he was the Head of the University Clinic for Cardiac Surgery in Salzburg.

While prof. Unger's primary interest is in cardiac surgery, his scientific interest is in assisted circulation and total artificial heart. He invented the ellipsoid heart for assisted circulation. Since 1977, there have been 22 clinical implantations under his guidance, 20 of which were left ventricular assist devices and 2 total artificial hearts. In March 1986 he performed the first staged total artificial heart - cardiac transplantation procedure in Europe.

Professor Unger is author and co-author of more than 400 publications, he has chaired several sessions at national and international meetings, he has given more than 60 scientific presentations. He has obtained three major awards; edited five books (among which: "*Assisted Circulation*", "*Assisted Circulation II*", "*Assisted Circulation III*",

"*Coronary Artery Surgery*"). Between 1979 and 1993 he acted as president of 9 scientific meetings in Innsbruck and Salzburg. In 1985, an International Workshop was held in Salzburg with the support of the European Society for Cardiology, European Society for Cardiac Surgery and the World Health Organization, Regional office for Europe under the title "*Coronary Artery Surgery for the Nineties*". 1993 he chaired the 3rd Annual Meeting of the international Society of Cardio-Thoracic Surgeons in Salzburg. He served as president of the International Society of Cardio-Thoracic Surgeons and has since the beginnings of the European Academy of Sciences and Arts been its president. A specific emphasis in this position has been the new role of universities, the European healthcare and the European Curriculum in Medicine. Professor Unger is married to Monika Unger and they have two sons, Stephan and Matthäus.
