

IZVJEŠĆE O ITHAS-U (MEĐUNARODNA AKADEMIJA TURIZMA I UGOSTITELJSTVA NA MORU) 2015, HRVATSKA

Međunarodna akademija turizma i ugostiteljstva na moru (ITHAS - International Tourism and Hospitality Academy at Sea) jedinstven je edukacijski program intenzivnog učenja za studente turizma i srodnih disciplina koji se održava na brodovima koji plove duž obala Jadrana. U tjedan dana ITHAS stapa velik broj predavanja, radionica, posjeta i prezentacija stručnjaka u relevantnim destinacijama, kao i mnoge multikulturne susrete, sunce, more, i iznimno entuzijazam. Organizator cijelog projekta je Katedra za turizam Ekonomskog fakulteta u Zagrebu u suradnji s I.D. Riva Tours GmbH, njemačkim turooperatorom specijaliziranim za putovanja u Hrvatskoj. ITHAS 2015 bio je posebno svečan zbog obilježavanja 10-godišnjice od prvog ovakvog studijskog programa.

U 10 posjećenih destinacija – Malinska, Rab, Lošinj, Pula, Venecija (Italija), Rovinj, Rabac, Krculi, Opatija i Rijeka – gdje su studenti i profesori imali priliku vidjeti i raspravljati o mnogim primjerima održivog i, u nekim slučajevima, neodrživog razvoja turizma i lokalnih zajednica. Sve su destinacije značajno doprinijele temi ovogodišnjeg edukacijskog modula dajući konkretnе primjere i argumente profesorima za teoretska predavanja i radionice, a studentima za protipitanja tih teorija u susretima s lokalnim turističkim stručnjacima kako bi neopterećeno inovativno i kreativno primijenili stečena znanja i spoznaje.

Glavna tema ITHAS-a 2015 održivi razvoj turizma profesionalno je povezivala sva predavanja, posjete destinacijama i prezentacije – pa čak i diskusije za večerom. U ugodnom ambijentu sjedeći za stolom s profesorima, poput Erika Cohena i Jafara Jafarija, budući su znatiželjni turistički stručnjaci imali

REPORT ON THE INTERNATIONAL TOURISM AND HOSPITALITY ACADEMY AT SEA 2015, CROATIA

The International Tourism and Hospitality Academy at Sea (ITHAS) is a unique intensive learning course for tourism students and students of related disciplines held whilst travelling by boat to several destinations along the Adriatic coast. Intensive study, multicultural encounters, sun, sea, stunning relevant destinations and enthusiasm are all mashed together to create ITHAS. The entire project is organized by the Department of Tourism of the Faculty of Economics and Business of Zagreb together with I.D Riva Tours GmbH from Munich, specialized in Croatian travel. ITHAS 2015 is especially unique seeing as it marks the 10th anniversary since the first ever ITHAS trip was organized.

Amongst the 10 destinations visited were Malinska, Rab, Lošinj, Pula, Venice (Italy), Rovinj, Rabac, Krculi, Opatija and Rijeka. The whole group of students and professors visited a number of both more sustainable and a handful of less sustainable tourism developments and communities. Each destination has a significant contribution to the course material and provided concrete examples and evidence to the theory and workshops organized allowing students to challenge these theories, the local tourism experts and to launch themselves “out of the box” and apply their acquired knowledge in a creative fashion.

Sustainable tourism development was the highlighted topic of ITHAS 2015 meet and was expertly incorporated into all lectures, destinations visits, presentations and even evening meal discussions. Professors soaring at the top of their fields such as Professors Erik Cohen and Jafar Jafari sharing a dinner table with their students provides a more than

iznimno rijetku priliku čuti mišljenja ovih vrhunskih stručnjaka u svojim područjima. Iako su mnoga pitanja postavljana nakon predavanja odudarala od glavne teme, ambijent ITHAS-a utjecao je da su se na kraju svi razgovori vraćali upravo na nju.

Rušenje zidova i uklanjanje formalnosti između profesora i studenata, koje je često naglašeno u akademskom okruženju, potiče puno više kritičkog razmišljanja i rađanje mnogih plodnih ideja nego u konvencionalnom ozračju predavaonice. Japanke, sunčane naočale, otvorenost za razna mišljenja i, možda, olovka i papir – to je sve što je potrebno sudioniku ITHAS-a da bude kreativan, produktivan i sposoban da duboko promišlja zadate teme. Putovanje na brodu ograničava korištenje elektroničkih alata, ali u isti mah i potiče kreativnost. Ne samo da studenti profitiraju sudjelovanjem u otvorenim diskusijama s nekim od najutjecajnijih lidera u svojim disciplinama, nego su i profe-

scarce opportunity for curious future experts to pick their brains in a comfortable environment. Although many questions asked after lectures were not necessarily related to the highlighted topic the ITHAS atmosphere somehow encourages for the topic to pop up in all conversation eventually.

Ripping down boundaries and removing the formalities; often enforced in an academic environment, between professors and students provokes much more critical thinking and numerous constructive ideas than that would be expected from a conventional “lecture hall” environment. Flip flops, sunglasses, an open mind and perhaps a pen and piece of paper are all that is necessary for an ITHAS participant to be creative, productive and be able to really reflect on the topics at hand. Travelling by boat limits the amount of lecture aids but simultaneously sparks creativity. Not only do students benefit from engaging in open discussions with some of the

sori puno saznali od studenata kroz komunikaciju na osobnoj razini.

Tijekom sedmodnevnog putovanja studenti su se susreli s brojnim izazovima, ali su i dobili mnoge nove spoznaje i iskustva. Kao zadatak koji je prethodio ITHAS-u studenti svake institucije morali su pripremiti i prezentirati svoj fakultet, zemlju i analizu održivosti jedne od 10 destinacija na programu. Osim toga, studenti su tijekom 40 sati predavanja, seminara i prezentacija imali jedinstvenu priliku propitivati se ne samo međusobno nego i ulaziti u akademske rasprave s profesorima. U susretima sa stručnjacima koji se bave ozbiljnim problemima u raznim područjima turizma studenti su mogli otvo-

most influential leaders in their disciplines but the professors also learnt a lot from their students having been introduced to them on a more interpersonal level.

During the 7 day trip students were challenged in numerous fashions and reaped the benefits of the learning outcomes. Each group was given a pre assignment requiring them to analyze and present the sustainability of one of the 10 destinations along with presenting themselves and their home nations. The 40+ hours of lectures provided a unique experience within students could not only challenge themselves academically but the professors also. Meeting professionals from the various areas who are tackling some se-

reno govoriti i predlagati konstruktivne i inovativne ideje za njihovo rješavanje.

Možda je najznačajniji dio putovanja i najveća dodana vrijednost bila činjenica da se među 112 sudionika programa ITHAS našao nevjerljatan broj od 31 nacije sa 6 partnerskih institucija u ovom projektu (*Munich University of Applied Sciences, University of Ljubljana, Faculty of Economics, German University of Technology, GUtech, OMAN, Jyväskylä University of Applied Sciences, School of Tourism and Services Management*). Tolerancija, razumijevanje, poštovanje i obazrivost – samo su neke od osobina koje se bruse u društvu tako raznolike grupe pojedinaca. K tomu, tu su i neprocjenjiva iskustva međusobnog upoznavanja kultura kroz razna osjetila (okus, zvuk, vid, dodir). Mnoga prijateljstva i poslovne veze započete na ITHAS-u sigurno će se pokazati još značajnijima u budućnosti za mnoge, ako ne i za sve sudionike.

Perhaps the most significant part of the trip and the real value addition is the fact that out of the 112 participants the ITHAS program boasts an unbelievable 31 nationalities arriving from 6 different institutions (Munich University of Applied Sciences, University of Ljubljana, Faculty of Economics, German University of Technology, GUtech, OMAN, Jyväskylä University of Applied Sciences, School of Tourism and Services Management) Tolerance, understanding, respect and consideration are just a handful of the traits one sharpens whilst being amongst such a diverse group of individuals let alone the invaluable experiences of sharing each other's cultures through more than one sense (taste, sound, sight, touch). Many of the friendships and business connections established during ITHAS will prove more
