INTRODUCING NEW MEMBERS OF THE EDITORIAL BOARD



Professor Valery Feigin, M.D., Ph.D.

Professor Valery Feigin has received education and training in internal medicine, clinical neurology and epidemiology in Russia where his medical and research career began. His career progressed from Junior Research Fellow level to full Professor of Neurology and Head of Department of Cerebrovascular Diseases. His further career and training in neurology, particularly in stroke medicine, and clinical epidemiology were advanced at Mayo Clinic, Rochester, MN, USA (1991-1995), Erasmus University (1995-1996), and the University of Utrecht, The Netherlands (1995-1997). Professor Feigin is member of a number of international professional societies, including American Academy of Neurology and Stroke Society of Australasia. Professor Feigin was a founding member of the European Federation of Neurological Societies (Chairman, Scientist Panel on Neuroepidemiology [1996-2004], and is current Chairman of the Task Force on Teaching of Clinical Epidemiology in Europe [2000-2004]).

Professor Feigin is a reviewer for a number of international research charity organizations and medical journals on stroke, cardiovascular disease and neurology, including Stroke, The Lancet, Lancet Neurology, European Journal of Neurology, and Journal of Neurology, Neurosurgery and Psychiatry. Professor Feigin is also member of the Editorial Board of two international journals, European Journal of Neurology and Updates in Neurology, Neuroscience and Aging. Professor Feigin has coauthored over 170 scientific publications, including 72 journal peer-reviewed articles, half of which have been published over the last 3 years, and several handbooks and guidelines for physicians. Professor Feigin was and is currently actively involved in teaching and postgraduate training/supervision of medical students ble stroke epidemiology research. In New Zealand Profes-

and young researchers. The Handbook of Stroke (Wiebers DO, Feigin VL, Brown R Jr, Mayo Clinic, Rochester, USA, 1997) was accepted by the Mayo Clinic as a textbook for medical undergraduate and postgraduate students. This textbook has been translated and published into 5 languages: Japanese, Spanish, Vietnamese, Italian and Russian (the second edition is currently in press), and the second edition of the book will be published in 2005-2006. His handbook entitled When Lightning Strikes. An Illustrated Guide to Stroke Prevention and Recovery has been published by HarperCollins Ltd., New Zealand/Australia in November 2004.

His systematic reviews (1997, 1999, 2003 and 2004) on calcium antagonists in patients with subarachnoid hemorrhage have been widely cited and included in major guidelines and books for physicians, including Harrison's handbook Principles of Internal Medicine. This has contributed to improved management of these patients in clinical practice (currently this treatment is considered a routine practice). In 2002, Professor Feigin was invited by the Editor of The Lancet Neurology to write a review article on stroke epidemiology. Such invited review articles appear in The Lancet only once every 5 to 7 years and they have a substantial impact on stroke epidemiology and health care research and practice. The review article (Feigin V, Lawes CL, Bennett D, Anderson C) was published in The Lancet Neurology in January 2003. Most recently (2004), Professor Feigin was invited to be Editor of the Neurology section of the 7-volume Encyclopedia of Public Health (Elsevier, USA), and to write two book chapters and three editorial comments containing important recommendations for future research in stroke epidemiology. Two articles have been published in Stroke and one article has appeared in The Lancet. Professor Feigin is also leading editor of the handbook Neuroepidemiology for the Clinician, to be published by Novascience Publishers Inc., USA, in 2006.

In 2003, Professor Feigin was awarded Honorary Professorship at the Novosibirsk State Medical Academy, Russia. At the national level, in Russia, Professor Feigin has been regarded as the founder of internationally comparaActa Clin Croat 2005; 44:3-5 New Members

sor Feigin was one of the founders of the first-ever Acute Stroke Unit in 2001 (Middlemore Hospital), and one of the leading authors of the management guidelines for stroke services approved and published by South Auckland Health in 2001. Since October 1999 Professor Feigin has been employed as a Senior Research Fellow and Associate Professor at the Clinical Trials Research Unit, The University of Auckland.
