/ MR. SKYPE – THE NEW MEMBER OF THE GROUP

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Krajem prošle godine pristigle su prve obavijesti za tradicionalni godišnji stručni sastanak Instituta za grupnu analizu Zagreb – kolokvijalno zvan Study days. Ove je godine održan 23. put. Tema stručnog sastanka bila je prilagođena vremenu u kojem živimo, vremenu brzoga tehnološkog napretka u kojem pojedinac kao član grupe mora pronaći svoje mjesto.

„Mr. Skype – novi član grupe“ tema je koja je okupila velik broj stručnjaka psihoterapeuta te je jedna od rijetkih prilika za njegovanje identiteta grupnih analitičara. Dvodnevno druženje održano je 15. i 16. ožujka 2019. u prostorijama Klinike za psihijatriju Vrapče.

Skup je kao i dosad bio međunarodnog karaktera; na njemu su prisustvovala 83 sudionika iz četiriju zemalja: Bosne i Hercegovine, Hrvatske, Srbije te Velike Britanije. Towards the end of 2018, first notifications regarding the now already traditional annual professional meeting of the Zagreb Institute of Group Analysis started pouring in. The event is commonly referred to as Study Days and this year, it was held for the 23rd time. The topic of the professional meeting was adapted accordingly, aptly reflecting the times we live in, the times of rapid technological advancement, in which an individual, as a group member, must find their place.

“Mr. Skype – The new member of the group” is a topic that has brought together a range of psychotherapy experts, and is one of the rare opportunities to foster the identity of group analysts. This two-day event took place on 15-16 March 2019 on the premises of the University Psychiatric Hospital Vrapče in Zagreb.

As in previous years, the gathering was of international character, and it was attended by 83 participants from four countries: Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Serbia and Great Britain. This time, motivated more than ever, us five group analysis enthusiasts from Mostar have accepted the invitation to participate in this event, and started our journey by carpooling to Zagreb together.

We had unbelievable luck with the weather, as it was the weekend before the official start of spring, and spring has already decided to make an appearance above Zagreb skies. We arrived with smiles on our faces, filled with desire for new experiences. We registered ourselves, looking for familiar faces and looking forward to a reunion with colleagues. We entered the room where the large group session was supposed to take place, we checked out the schedule and we realized that the function of the group leader has been entrusted to Aldo Špelić. The chairs were aligned in three circles and we decided to settle in the second one, as the first circle is usually reserved for the experts - the last to enter the room. The silence was broken by Professor Hasanović, with remembrance remarks about the late Professor Jukić. We were all left deep in thought after Professor Frančišković's comment that "death is the last new experience in life"...

The activities quickly picked up, large group resulting in bigger regression. I noticed immediate creation of dyadic pairs, the overall indifference. I felt that there was no freedom of expression, and certain participants had a tendency to monopolise the time with

topics largely unrelated to the theme of this event. Perhaps the group leader could have intervened in order to streamline the conversation and make it more challenging.

“Mr. Skype” is present and recognized as a full member of the group and we cannot ignore it anymore. Technology has become intertwined with our daily life, so much so that we have come to accept that, in today’s world, it is difficult to function without it.

Sylvia Hutchinson, psychotherapist, group analyst and former president of the EGATIN group, was the guest lecturer this year. She had a very interesting lecture entitled: *Group Analytic Identity: Constructing identities in the age of the smartphone*. It was difficult to maintain interest due to the way in which the presentation was delivered, reading projections from a Word document, which slightly reduced the overall impression and the hard work done by the lecturer. Professor Urlić made his point, followed by a short discussion, after which participants’ fatigue was palpable. “Mr. Skype” should imply modernisation in the way presentations are delivered, in order to make the atmosphere livelier and to engage participants in acquiring new knowledge. I was under the impression that we were still slightly reluctant to accept Mr. Skype as the new member of the group.

After a short break, we hastily searched for the lists of small groups, looking at who got assigned into which group, and who are the group leaders. There were seven lists on the board with Marija Bačan, Branka Begovac, Vedran Bilić, Dolores Britvić, Mevludin Hasanović, Sanja Janović and Mirjana Pernar being chosen as leaders of each group.

All previous efforts to change such an atmosphere resulted in conflict. Lawlessness, chaos and disorder are still omnipresent. Although the war ended a long time ago, conflict is still acutely felt everywhere.

At the end of the motorway Zagreb-Split, we were greeted by a spectacular sunset, which lifted the mood and made us think about nicer things. Thrilled by this experience, we talked about the transformation process, about "Mr. Skype", and about the wonderful feeling of being a part of this whole story, and being a member of the extended family of the Institute for Group Analysis. We felt very welcomed as guests, we enjoyed encountering familiar faces, and we returned to Mostar truly fulfilled and reenergized by this encounter.
