As also previously mentioned, additional space has been given to two papers in the section *Artificial Intelligence Humanities*. The first article combines qualitative and quantitative analysis to analyze the interrelationship between Mesopotamia's Epic of Gilgamesh and the Bible's Genesis through intertextuality analysis. The second deals with the phenomenal problems involved in the AI era such as the information bubble, post-truth, and digital prison, all coming from an environment based on AI technology.

I am also pleased to see the continuation of scientific conferences as two scientific meeting reviews are also a part of this issue, as well as a book review.
