

Editorial

It is our great pleasure to present the 28th issue of *Jabr – European Journal of Bioethics*. We are continuing our collaboration with the Humanities Research Institute from Chung-Ang University in Seoul, South Korea, which has once again resulted in a special section devoted to Artificial Intelligence Humanities while keeping enough room for other bioethical contributions in rapidly growing interests on different topics and issues related to bioethics and medical humanities.

The general section begins with a contribution to understanding of informed consent in the light of necessary educational premises for its adequate implementation by presentation and analysis of a case study from Ecuador. There are two bioethical contributions closely related to medical sociology. The first presents the results of a quantitative study of students' perception of social control and marijuana use in Zagreb, and the second reveals sociocultural pressures in the development of eating disorders from a sociological perspective. Certain factors that have an impact on the quality of life of elderly people are elaborated in the next contribution. The next article aims to discuss the subject of euthanasia and assisted suicide through a historical anamnesis. The future of humanity in the context of transhumanism is critically considered in the last contribution.

As previously mentioned, additional space has been given to three papers in the section *Artificial Intelligence Humanities*. The first article provides case study of a class on classical narratives using ChatGPT on the example of retelling classical Korean narratives. The second deals with the test reliability in case law by analysis of Korean precedent judgment criteria on the degree of assault and intimidation. The last contribution in this section tries to answer the question if artificial intelligence and education are rivals or allies.

Two book reviews are also a part of this issue.

I would like to thank the members of the Editorial Board, peer reviewers, and all other associates involved in the creation of this issue. Special thanks to the Executive Editor, Managing Editors, and our Language Editors for their tremendous help. A special thanks goes to the editor of the special AIH section.
