FOREWORD

Dear readers,

In the new issue of Polytechnica, we bring you interesting topics relating to technical (engineering) and IT education, as well as topics relating to sustainability and sustainable development, which are equally important for all of us. The first article gives an overview of the knowledge and regulations related to unpleasant odour pollution, about which very little is known and written, especially among the general public. The second article presents a survey on students' preferences for technical and technological content in relation to specific regions in Croatia.
