The symposium was officially opened by academician Marko Pećina, representing the Department of Medical Sciences of the Croatian Academy of Sciences and Arts. The presentations covered a wide range of topics within dermatovenerology, emphasizing both common and rare dermatological conditions. Residents discussed diagnostic challenges and management strategies for rare autoimmune and inflammatory conditions, offering insights into differential diagnoses and treatment protocols. Furthermore, presentations also covered rare and atypical skin tumors, the clinical manifestations of metastatic melanoma, and the side effects of emerging oncological therapies. The importance of early detection and the role of dermatologists in coordinating multidisciplinary care were recurrent themes. Lastly, infectious diseases, sexually transmitted infections, metabolic skin conditions, and vasculopathies were explored, emphasizing their prevalence in general dermatological practice and the need for accurate diagnosis and effective treatment.

In addition, significant highlight of the symposium was its emphasis on the importance of multidisciplinary collaboration. Dermatologists were encouraged to work closely with oncologists, pathologists, radiologists, and other specialists to ensure comprehensive care for patients. The integration of various medical disciplines is crucial in the early detection, diagnosis, and treatment of complex dermatological conditions, particularly in the realm of dermato-oncology. Moreover, the symposium's fully attended venue reflected the substantial interest and commitment of Croatia's dermatological community to advancing knowledge and improving patient care. The event served as a platform for exchanging ideas, fostering collaboration, and inspiring the next generation of dermatologists through the active participation of residents.
