Welcome to the summer issue of Psychiatria Danubina. The journal is currently in its second and, we hope, final year of the two-year Clarivate WoS embargo. We believe that for psychiatry to be useful to medicine, society, humankind, and global sustainability, expanding its field of activity and fostering creative alliances with other professions and scientific disciplines is essential. Psychiatria Danubina is dedicated to promoting integrative health and mental well-being for all.

We are delighted to inform you that two new multidisciplinary journals, "Medicina Academica Integrativa" (ISSN 3029-3308 for print and 3029-3316 for online) and "Science, Art and Religion" (eISSN: 3048-4804), have evolved from special editions of Psychiatria Danubina into independent journals with specific and significant missions.

#### MEDICINA ACADEMICA INTEGRATIVA

The journal Medicina Academica Integrativa originated as Medicina Academica Mostariensia (MAM) in 2013, a special edition of Psychiatria Danubina aimed at supporting the postgraduate (PhD) program at the School of Medicine, University of Mostar, Bosnia and Herzegovina. Despite our initial efforts, we did not succeed in establishing MAM as a separate journal within the PD family of journals. However, in 2022, it was renamed Medicina Academica Integrativa (Jakovljević, 2022a), and as of this year, it has become a new journal of the University of Mostar. It is an open-access, international, peer-reviewed scholarly journal dedicated to promoting original ideas, research, concepts, and theories regarding integrative, holistic, interdisciplinary, and transdisciplinary approaches in academic medicine.

The understanding and treatment of multimorbidity, comorbidity, and systemic diseases benefit greatly from the perspective of integrative medicine, as particularly evidenced during the COVID-19 syndemics (Jakovljević et al., 2021). Academic medicine integrates evidence-based

practices, value-based approaches, and narrative-based approaches from both conventional and non-conventional medicine in a complementary, comprehensive, and holistic manner. The contribution of academic integrative medicine, as a humanistic discipline, should focus on promoting a culture of empathy, peace, and a global ethic of biophilia as the foundation of public and global health. This unifying approach aims to bring together people, nations, and civilizations for global well-being, sustainability, and security (Jakovljević, 2022b).

Medicina Academica Integrativa is founded on the principles of an empathic learning organization, aiming to bridge the gap between various branches of medicine. Its goal is to foster education through mutually respectful cooperation among multiple conventional and non-conventional medical disciplines, integrating three crucial concepts in modern medicine: evidence-based medicine, value-based medicine, and narrative-based medicine. The journal encompasses various perspectives and disciplines within medicine, including education and training approaches, health, science, institutional policy, research, clinical practice, and management. Our ultimate goal is to bridge epistemic gaps and improve communication and cooperation among health professionals and scholars from different systems of medicine and healthcare.

#### SCIENCE, ART AND RELIGION

Science, Art and Religion is the official journal of the International Academy of Science and Arts in Bosnia and Herzegovina, established in 2021. It is the only one of the six official academies registered at the state level of Bosnia and Herzegovina, while the others are registered at the cantonal level. Bosnia and Herzegovina faces a deep identity crisis. Empathically integrating sciences, arts, and religions in creative dialogues as allies could significantly contribute to the healing the broken spirit and identity of Bosnia and Herzegovina (Jakovljević, 2022b). Transformative empathization offers hope and solutions for broken relationships and stuck institutions in Bosnia

and Herzegovina, as well as for its salvation and progress (Jakovljević, 2022c). Empathy is our basic human ability manifesting itself in different ways in different cultures, contexts, life scripts and narratives. Unfortunately, intergroup empathy gaps and intercultural dyspathy is common so that our world is in the zone of high risks and dangers (Jakovljevic 2022c). A global empathic civilization seems to be the key to the very survival of human-kind and life on our planet (Jakovljević, 2021). Bosnia and Herzegovina could benefit greatly from promotion of ideas that are the foundation of empathic civilization.
