

All the participants agreed to establish cooperation on the basis of the long-term activities of the Task Group 3 within the frame of the PCC. Those activities should include:

- creating of the strong ground motion consistent data base,
- improvement of the methodologies and procedures for the data reductions,
- implementations and testing of the above studies by establishing some pilot projects in the participating countries,
- consideration of possibility to create such a macroseismic scale which can be correlated to the strong ground motion parameters; such a scale should take into account the present practice and constructions (as well as the possibility of its modification in future).

It was proposed that the second meeting of TG3 will be held in Zagreb in November 1990.

The annual meeting of the Editorial Board of *GEOFIZIKA*, Zagreb, 2 June, 1989

Minutes:

On 2 June, 1989 the Editorial Board of *Geofizika* held its annual meeting at the Geophysical Institute in Zagreb, with the following agenda:

1. The annual and financial report
2. Acceptance of manuscripts for Vol. 6
3. Election of the new members of the Editorial Board
4. Diverse

ad 1) Dr. Inga Lisac, the editor-in-chief, presented the annual (Appendix) and financial reports, which were unanimously accepted.

ad 2) The present members of the Editorial Board accepted the classification of eight papers to appear in Vol. 6 as proposed by the editors and referees.

ad 3) Dr. I. Lisac informed the Board of her decision to resign from the editor-in-chief position due to health problems. Dr. Mirko Orlić, former secretary of *Geofizika*, was elected editor-in-chief for the following mandate. The new secretary is to be elected subsequently. The board members expressed their heartfelt gratitude for everything that Dr. I. Lisac did during past five years for establishing and promoting the journal.

According to the former decision three esteemed geophysicists from abroad were invited to join the Editorial Board. Prof. S.J. Duda from Hamburg, Prof. F. Stravisi from Trieste and Prof K. Bernhardt from Berlin kindly sent their consent and were elected the members of the Editorial Board.

ad 4) Dr. I Lisac informed the Board that the Institute for Informational Sciences in Zagreb classified *Geofizika* into the highest category among 16 other Croatian journals.

The members of the Board accepted the mailing list for 1989 as proposed by the editors.

Appendix: Report on the activities of editors of the Geofizika journal in the period 1987/88.

In the years 1987 and 1988 editors of the *Geofizika* journal have been engaged in the following activities:

1. Volume 4 has been published, containing 13 papers and 11 abstracts dealing with physics of the atmosphere and the sea. The papers had previously been presented at the Symposium "Observations and Modelling in Geophysics", Zagreb, 11-13 June 1986; following the expressed wish of authors, some presentations have undergone the reviewing process, and some have been published as conference papers. Volume 4 has been mailed to about 220 foreign and 40 Yugoslav institutions.
2. Presentations from the above mentioned Symposium, dealing with physics of the Earth's interior, have been published in Volume 5. The same editorial procedure has been applied, with 10 papers and 4 abstracts appearing finally in print. Volume 5 has been mailed to about 250 foreign and 40 Yugoslav institutions.
3. Eight papers have been prepared for publication in Volume 6. For each paper, opinions of two reviewers have been sought after, and – with one exception – it has been suggested that papers be accepted with minor or major revisions. A reviewer of one of the papers suggested rejection; however, the other review was positive, and the editor-in-chief provided another review. After revision, the paper was eventually accepted for publication. Some other material have also been submitted for publication in Volume 6: obituary for late prof. B. Makjanić, review of the book by R. Brázdil, etc.
4. Preparations are being made for publication of Volume 7. It is intended to dedicate the Volume to prof. S. Škreb, former director of the Geophysical Institute. A four-member committee (prof. K. Kempni, dr I. Lisac, prof. F. Margetić and Mrs B. Volarić, M.Sc.) is preparing introductory texts for the Volume. The authors are encouraged to submit papers that would make the Volume a real tribute to the man who helped maintaining high standards of geophysical sciences in Yugoslavia.
5. In accord with the decision of the Editorial Board, profs. K. Bernhardt (Berlin), S. J. Duda (Hamburg) and F. Stravisi (Trieste) have been invited to become members of the Board. They have accepted the invitation, and are already included in the activities of the Editorial Board as reviewers and advisers.
6. Financial reports have been regularly prepared and sent to "Republička zajednica za znanstveni rad SR Hrvatske", which is subsidizing the journal. Moreover, a report describing experiences and difficulties in publishing the *Geofizika* journal has been sent to the Institute for Informational Sciences (IIS). The journal was included by IIS in the group of 17 Croatian publications which fulfill the quality criteria necessary to ensure continuous financial support.
