Appendix 1. Some specific expressions related to wedding customs in the Dalmatian Hinterland

BARJAKTAR (FLAG BEARER) - a wedding guest who carries a flag

BRUS - red silk thread

BUKLIJA – a practice in which neighbors offer drinks to wedding guests

BURAĆA – wine container made of goat's skin, with wooden opening

ČAUŠ – a guest at a wedding whose duty it is to take care of the atmosphere at the wedding

ČOJA – woolen cloth

DIVER – the groom's brother

DOTA – the bride's belongings, which she brings to her new home, dowry

ĐUVEGLIJA – the groom

ENGA – the sister, sister-in-law or first cousin of the groom who accompanies the bride at the wedding

 $JA\check{C}ERMA - a$ kind of dress below the knee, adorned with silk worn by the bride for the wedding

KANPARAN – a heavy cloak

KROŽET – a vest

LEMOZINA -alms

LONČINA or TARITAVA – the cook at the wedding

MAŠKLIN – a mattock

MUTAP – a goat hair rug

NAPOVID – the announcement of the wedding in church at Sunday Mass

OBILJEŽJE – a ring, a pin, a medal, and gold coins that a girl would receive from the groom's father if she agreed to marry

ODIVA – the arrival of the bride at her house

OKRETANJE NA OPOSUN – turning the bride in the direction of the movement of the Sun

PALA – a short sword

PAS – a belt

PEŠKIR – a towel

POHODI or PO'OĐANI – the first arrival of the bride's mother and her brother in her new home

PRVINAC – a guest at the wedding leading the wedding procession

RUŠNICA – a purse

SINĐIR – a type of necklace

STAĆELI or STAĆENBAŠI – wedding guests without a duty

 $STARI\ SVAT$ – the guest at the wedding whose duty it is to make sure that everything goes well, that is, the leader of the wedding

ŠUDAR – a headscarf

ŠUDARIĆ – a handkerchief

TERLUKE – woolen handmade socks

TKANICA – a narrow belt

UGOVOR or JABUKA – an agreement on the wedding details between two people from the groom's and bride's households

 $ZA\check{C}INA-a$ wedding guest who was allowed to enter the kitchen and check if the food was salty
