ETHICAL STATEMENT

Ethical and research integrity Statement in the journal *Problemi sjevernog Jadrana* (Problems of the Northern Adriatic) was prepared according to COPE's Best Practice Guidelines for Journal Editors. Everyone who participates in the process of creating and publishing the work - author(s), reviewer(s) and editor / Editorial Board – is invited to ethical behaviour. That is why this Ethics Statement is divided into three parts:

1. Obligations for Authors

Authors submit only unpublished manuscripts to the editors. The references to another author must be correctly credited and acknowledged in the manuscript. Plagiarism in any form is not allowed. For the purposes of the review, the author may be invited to attach the data used in the research. The author may not submit to the editors a manuscript whose content has already been published or offered to another editor. The author assumes responsibility for the content of the manuscript. In the case of secondary publication, the author must indicate where the article was first published. If there are several authors, the one who submits the manuscript to the editors must have the consent of the other co-authors.

Other regulations of the COPE's Best Practice Guidelines for Journal Editors also apply to Obligations for Authors.

2. Peer Reviewer Responsibilities

The reviewer reads the received manuscript and writes his opinion on the review form, which must be objective, comprehensible, and well-argued. The received manuscript must be treated as a confidential document. The reviewer should warn about content overlap of the manuscript with an already published article. Reviewers should not use information gained in peer review to their own advantage.

Other regulations of the COPE's Best Practice Guidelines for Journal Editors also apply to Peer Reviewer Responsibilities.

3. Responsibilities of the editor and the Editorial Board

The editor / Editorial Board accepts the proposed categorization and is responsible for deciding which of the manuscripts submitted to the journal will be published. In making the final decision on the final categorization and publication of the manuscript, the editor may consult with members of the Editorial Board. The editor / Editorial Board evaluates manuscripts for their intellectual content, regardless of the author's ethnicity, race, gender, religion, sexual orientation, citizenship, or political belief. The content of an unpublished manuscript cannot be used in a reviewer's own research without the express written consent of the author. The editor / member of the Editorial Board cannot discuss manuscripts with persons who are not involved in the process of publishing the manuscript.

Other regulations of the COPE's Best Practice Guidelines for Journal Editors also apply to editor / Editorial Board Responsibilities.
