

Collected papers of Šibenik College is a scientific and professional journal that adheres to the highest standards of editorial ethics, the principles of the Code of Ethics at the Polytechnic of Šibenik, and the principles of the Code of Conduct for Journal Editors (COPE). Honesty, originality, and integrity by authors, as well as fairness, objectivity, and confidentiality by editors and reviewers, are the values on which the editing and publishing of the Collected papers of Šibenik College are based.

To offer quality content to the readership, we list the following principles of ethics in editorial work, which must be adhered to by authors, reviewers, and publishers of the Collected papers of Šibenik College.

If it is discovered that the article submitted for publication does not comply with these principles, it will not be published in the Collected papers of Šibenik College.

Articles are subject to objective impartial anonymous review.

Through the process of reviewing and editing, the possibility of plagiarism and falsification of content is monitored. In case of plagiarism, the Editorial Board informs the author about it and takes other measures.

Authors of articles must guarantee the authenticity of published articles. Authors are expected to adequately label the words of other authors, contributors, or sources. Authors who submit articles for the Collected papers of Šibenik College must guarantee that the articles are their original work and that neither parts nor the entire article is plagiarized without citing the sources used. Any part of the work that is a quotation or paraphrase of someone else's words or deeds must be marked with a reference from where it was taken. Authors should draw attention to potential financial or other conflicts of interest that could affect the results or interpretation of their article. If the author discovers an error in the article, he/she is obliged to inform the Editorial Board of the Journal and provide support to eliminate the error or withdraw the article. The authors are also obliged to correct the articles following the recommendations of the reviewers, to ensure the quality of the articles. All articles are submitted in electronic form. The publisher provides an anonymous review of articles submitted for publication in the Journal. It will endeavor to prevent any potential conflict of interest between the author and the publisher. The publisher also guarantees that the data related to the submitted works will be kept secret until publication, and if the article does not meet the criteria for publication, the data will remain permanently secret. The publisher reserves the right to check whether the articles are original by any means (plagiarism detection programs, etc.).

The publisher strives to meet the needs of authors and readers and is constantly working to improve the quality of the publication. Through the review process by renowned reviewers, it ensures the quality of articles published in the Journal. The publisher guarantees the author's freedom of expression and is always ready to publish corrections, clarifications, or apologies, if necessary.

The Editor-in-Chief of the Collected papers of Šibenik College shall take justified measures if he/she is presented with ethical complaints about the article submitted for publication or an already published article, in cooperation with the Editorial Board of the Journal. These

measures will include contacting the authors with a clear explanation of the complaints received but may also include communication with the relevant institutions and investigative bodies. If the complaint proves to be true, the publisher withdraws the work without publication, or in the next issue of the Journal publishes a correction, expression of concern, or some other relevant note. The Editorial Board of the Journal is obliged to investigate any reported unethical behavior concerning published articles regardless of when the article was published.

Reviewers rate articles anonymously based on content regardless of ethnicity, gender, sexual orientation, citizenship, religious beliefs, or political beliefs of the author. Reviewers are required to keep all information about submitted manuscripts secret and notify the Editor-in-Chief of the Journal if they notice that the authors are infringing copyright or their work is plagiarism. They evaluate the works objectively and clearly explain their evaluation in the review form. If the reviewer notices that he/she is not qualified to evaluate the article or that he/she is not able to evaluate it, he/she is obliged to inform the Editor-in-Chief.

The Editor-in-Chief is responsible for deciding which of the submitted articles will be published. Decisions should be made based on the quality criteria and relevance of the article to researchers and readers. When making decisions, the Editor-in-Chief may consult with reviewers, members of the Editorial Board of the Journal, and other bodies. The evaluation of articles in which the Editor-in-Chief, an employee of the publisher, or a member of the Editorial Board of the Journal appears in the role of the author should be done in a way that ensures an impartial review.

In the case of two negative reviews of the submitted manuscript, the Editor-in-Chief of the Collected papers of Šibenik College makes a decision not to accept the article for publication in the Journal. The Editor-in-Chief should actively seek the opinions of authors, readers, reviewers, members of the Editorial Board of the Journal on the improvement of the journal. The Editor-in-Chief has to support initiatives that will lead to as few violations of academic rules as possible and to acquaint researchers with the provisions on publishing ethics. The journal's policy should be changed as necessary, taking into account new professional and scientific knowledge about the editing and publishing of the journal, and the effects of the journal's policy on the behavior of authors and reviewers.
