

# Guidelines for Authors

The *Croatian Studies Review* is a peer-reviewed multidisciplinary journal boasting an international editorial board. Published by the Croatian Studies Centre at Macquarie University (Sydney, Australia), the Journal concentrates on various topics encompassing Croatian culture, language, linguistics, history, art, literature, migration, identity, transnational and postcolonial studies, Croats in Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatian minorities in European countries (Hungary, Slovenia, Slovakia, Romania, Serbia, Macedonia, Montenegro, and Italy), and Croatian communities in other European countries and overseas territories. The Journal aims to foster scholarly works that contribute significantly to academia, whether in terms of theory, history, or policy. Its language of publication is English.

This journal is featured in the CEEOL (Central and Eastern European Online Library) repository and is indexed in the Ulrichsweb global serials directory. Accepted articles are published free of charge for authors, available in both hard copy and online formats.

The article length is restricted to 10,000 words, while book reviews should not exceed 2,500 words, inclusive of bibliography, footnotes, and, for articles, abstracts and summaries in Croatian. Should a book review encompass multiple books, its length can extend beyond 2,500 words, with an upper limit of 5,000 words.

Please format the text using Times New Roman (size 12 for the main body, 11 for abstracts, summaries, and footnotes, and size 18 for headings), with 1.5 line spacing.

Starting from 2022, Croatian Studies Review employs the APA 7th Edition referencing style. For more details, refer to [apastyle.apa.org](http://apastyle.apa.org).

The journal *Croatian Studies Review* is dedicated to upholding rigorous ethical standards and anticipates all contributors involved in the publication process to adhere to ethical research practices.

Every article undergoes a double-blind peer review. Upon review completion, authors may be requested by referees to implement suggested changes, if deemed necessary by the editors.
