

INSTRUCTIONS FOR AUTHORS

The Journal “Logopedija” is the official journal of Croatian Logopedics Association and Department of Speech and Language Pathology, Faculty of Education and Rehabilitation Sciences (University of Zagreb). The journal publishes original scientific papers, professional articles, reviews and preliminary communications in the field of logopaedics and related sciences and professions, as well as other information concerning logopaedic profession (conferences, book reviews, activities of professional organizations, etc.).

Review procedure

The basic requirement for the submission of the article is that it has not been previously published and it is not subject of the review at another journal.

In journal Logopedija, two external reviewers, engaged in a double-blind review system, assess each submitted manuscript. These reviewers, who are not part of the Editorial Board, contribute to maintaining a high level of objectivity and thorough evaluation of the scientific quality for every submitted article.

So, in accordance with that, all the papers that pass the first editorial control are subject to the so-called double blind review process which does not reveal the identity of the authors or reviewers. Therefore, the authors are asked to remove from the text and list of references, as well as from the properties of the electronic document, all the information that can reveal their identity (name, project information). After receiving the reviews, the authors, in addition to the new version of the manuscript, submit to the editorial board a cover letter stating which reviewers’ proposals were accepted and in what way, and which were not (with explanation and argumentation). The editorial board reserves the right to revise the manuscript to the journal’s standards in terms of editing and language.

Review process usually takes 4-6 weeks.

Rights

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Journal Logopedija does not charge any fees to authors to submit or publish articles in the journal.

Research ethics

Research should be in accordance with the applicable ethical rules and codes of conduct of research. The editorial board may request confirmation from the authors that the research was approved by the ethics committee of the relevant institution.

Technical instructions

- Submit an electronic form of the manuscript should be sent to casopislogopedija@erf.hr.
- Manuscript should be in Croatian or English, typewritten, double-spaced, on A4 paper, with numbered pages.
- Manuscript should be as short a possible in respect to clarity of the content, but it should not exceed 6000 words.
- The limit for the paper title is 130 characters, including spaces.
- Submitted manuscript should be organized in following manner: Title page (page 1), Abstract (page 2), Text (page 3 and following pages), References, and (optionally) Appendix.
- The title page should contain: title, author(s), affiliation address, and full address, e-mail of the corresponding author (The editorial board will delete this information before sending the manuscript to be reviewed).
- Author/s should add an English title of article.
- The abstract should contain no exceed 200 words and should indicate the aim of the work, the methodology used, and the most important findings and conclusions. Authors should specify up to five keywords.
- The text of the manuscript of original research paper should be arranged in following manner: Introduction (the data that define the problem), Methods (material used to conduct the research, the description of the subjects,...), Results and Discussion, and References. Both figures and tables should be inserted in the text at the place where they fit the best. All figures and tables should have clear captions, should not exceed A4 format, and should be acceptable for formatting in Word program. Graphs/figures/charts must remain editable (they must not be in the form of an uneditable image).
- The journal uses APA style (<http://www.apastyle.org/>) to format references in the text and bibliography. In the reference list or bibliography, the author should provide full references for all the works mentioned in the text; also, the reference list should contain only those sources mentioned in the text. They should be listed alphabetically according to the surname of the author, and chronologically if a particular author has more than one work. If several works by the same author were published in the same year, they should be differentiated by letters (a, b, c, etc.) following the year of publication. If a work was written by several authors, all authors should be listed instead of using "et al." or "and collaborators". When an article or bibliographic record has a DOI, use the DOI number in the reference list (for example DOI: 10.1016/j.jneuroling.2009.06.001).

Formatting references according to APA style (7th edition)

The list of references (literature) for all citations in the text is listed on a separate page at the end of your paper.

Citations within the text in your work, with the purpose of briefly identifying the sources you quoted or paraphrased, are recorded as follows:

- **Direct quotation** – put double quotation marks in the quotation and include page numbers, eg..... "socially the most important lesson of psychology concerns the influence of our social environment" (Myers , 2014, p. 105).
- **Paraphrasing** - page numbers do not need to be included Research (Kramer , 2013) shows that ... or Kramer's research (2013) shows that ...

The rule related to the number of authors on a paper:

In the text for all papers with 3 or more authors, write the name of the first author and et al.. It is the same for the first mention and for all future mentions.

In the list of references, write all authors up to 20 authors, and if the work has 21 authors or more, include the first 19 names author, then insert three dots (but not &) and add last name author.

Citing a source within another source (secondary sources)

For sources that you have not actually read but are mentioned in another work, cite the secondary source (the one you have read) in the reference list. In the text, indicate the source you have not read: Author (year) according to (according to) Author (year) of the work you have read.

Example:

Bibliography: Stone, RJ (2013). Human resource management. Wiley .

Citation in the text: Bennett (2000, according to Stone, 2013) defined ... OR ... (Bennett , 2000, according to Stone, 2013)

Serial numbers are not included in **the bibliography** . References must be arranged **alphabetically** , regardless of the type of source. Use the hanging indent mark to organize the references in the bibliography.
