Guidelines for Authors

Napredak - a journal for interdisciplinary research in education publishes original scientific and professional papers from all scientific and artistic disciplines whose results and reflections pertain to the educational process in the broadest sense and at all levels of the educational system.

Prior to publication, papers undergo a **preliminary methodological evaluation and a double-blind review procedure**.

It is required that the article be accompanied by a declaration stating that it is not presently under consideration for publication in any other journal and has not been previously released.

Electronic paper submissions should be directed to napredak.hpkz@gmail.com. Scientific papers (reviews, original scientific papers, and preliminary communications) are permitted a maximum length of one and a half sheet (a sheet comprises 30,000 characters, spaces included).

The paper's title should be succinct, unambiguous, and pertinent to the subject matter. The author's name and surname (along with the title), the name and address of the institution where he or she is employed, and the email address to which the ORCID number can be associated should be included below the paper's title. When two or more authors are involved, identical information should be included for all of them.

The **abstract** ought to encompass the following sections: the paper's objectives, foundational theoretical and methodological frameworks, principal findings, and concluding remarks. It should be written in English and Croatian and not exceed 120 words in length. An alphabetical listing of no more than five scientifically and professionally significant keywords that are relevant to the subject matter and not included in the paper's title is required.

Scientific papers are permitted to be published in English. As for the translation, the author bears responsibility. Proofreading is an essential requirement for all written works, irrespective of their language. Unedited texts that have been translated using automatic translation programmes will be returned to the authors.

Shorter papers (reviews, overviews, notes, notifications) may not exceed eight standard pages in length (each standard page contains 1800 characters, spaces included).

Categorization of papers:

- 1) An original scientific paper is a paper that, as determined by the editors and reviewers, presents novel theoretical or practical findings of original research that have not been previously published.
- 2) A preliminary communication presents new findings from scientific research (whether concluded or ongoing).
- 3) A review is an original, succinct, and critical presentation of the current status and future directions of research in a particular field, accompanied by a critical evaluation and assessment. In order to offer a strong understanding of the subject matter at hand, the cited literature should be sufficiently comprehensive.

4) A professional paper provides information on a subject related to the profession and proposes innovative solutions from within the profession's domain. The paper is not required to be in line with original research, but it must involve the application of established scientific findings and their modification to suit practical requirements. Additionally, it should contribute to the dissemination of knowledge.

Papers are to be composed in the Microsoft Office Word application using Times New Roman font (size 12 for the primary text and 11 for footnotes, references, image and table captions). No page numbers are to be insterted. Writing papers in a logical sequence that is both clear and comprehensible is essential. Titles and subtitles are to be written in bold.

Referencing is governed by APA 7 Style.

The identical information is presented in either tabular or graphical formats.
