SCOPUS

Topics of interest include, but are not limited to:

- Metaphysics and ontology
- Ethics and moral philosophy
- Epistemology and philosophy of mind

SCOPUS

Application conditions:

- Works must be original works of authorship
- The default font is Times New Roman, 12, spacing 1.5
- Submissions can be on any philosophical topic or on a topic from other scientific disciplines treated in a philosophical context
- Translations, interviews, reviews of recent editions - 9000 to 27000 characters
- Author's works - 14400 to 27000 characters (longer works will also be considered)
- Essays - up to 10800 characters
- Author's works must include an abstract (about 1000 characters with spaces) and 5 to 10 keywords, in Croatian and English
- The official languages of the journal are Croatian, Serbian, Bosnian, Montenegrin and English
- The official alphabet is Latin
- On the first page of the submission, in the upper left corner, it is necessary to state the name and surname of the author, the name and address of the faculty, the course of study and the level the author is currently attending, and the e-mail address
- Thesis of undergraduate, graduate and doctoral studies will be accepted

SCOPUS

Instructions to authors (citation and literature):

- Quotations within the text are separated by quotation marks "..."
- Submissions must be cited according to the APA system

For example:

Bušljeta, Rona; Piskač, Davor (2018) *Bibliotherapy in the teaching of literature*. Zagreb: Croatian Studies.

In this context, insight is an important term. "At the same time, insight refers to insight into emotion as such and insight into the process of the emergence of emotion and its effect on human motivation." (Bušljeta & Piskač, 2018: 54).

- In the case of consecutive citations, it is necessary to indicate the mark *Ibid* in the footnote with a page number
- Footnotes can also be used in case of additional explanation of a term, work or comment
- As a relevant source, it is possible to use a book, a dictionary, a collection of works, an article from a journal, an article from the Internet, an interview, and they must be included in the list of references in alphabetical order according to the rules of the APA system
- As long as the authors adhere to the recommended way of citing sources, the review and proofreading process itself will be easier and faster, and thus the publication of articles.
