

The way of writing bibliographic units (References)

A list of references should be added at the end of the article.

Only cited literature should be listed in the bibliography.

Write a list of references in Times New Roman 10 font with a spacing of 1.15.

Do not number literature.

References should be cited in straight letters (need not be italicized), write commas (not dots) between parts of the bibliographic unit, and write dots after ordinal numbers. In the sense of - to write a hyphen, not a hyphen. Write a colon so that there is no space on the left, and there is on the right.

For example:

An article in a magazine

Stjepan Babić, 2008, O uništenom hrvatskom prijenovosadskom pravopisu, *Jezik*, vol. 55, no. 3, p. 102. - 105.

Paper in a collection of papers / books

Stjepan Babić, 1996., Odnos Stjepana Ivšića prema hrvatskome književnome jeziku, in the collection of papers *Stjepan Ivšić i hrvatski jezik*, editor Božidar Finka, HAZU i MH Ogranak Oraštica, Zagreb, p. 25. – 31.

A book

Stjepan Babić, 2004, *Hrvanja hrvatskoga*, ŠK, Zagreb

Multi-author book

Stjepan Babić and authors, 1991., *Povijesni pregled, glasovi i oblici hrvatskoga književnog jezika*, NZ Globus i HAZU, Zagreb (Stjepan Babić, Dalibor Brozović, Milan Mogaš, Slavko Pavešić, Stjepko Težak, Ivo Škarić)

Citing literature in the text

(Babić, 2004)

(Babić and authors, 1991.)

Internet sources

Upload link. If there are multiple links write them separated by semicolons ;. Links should not be in color and underlined:
