

## References

References should be numbered consecutively, in the order in which they were first mentioned in the text. Mark references in the text, tables and legends with Arabic numerals. The number of reference in the text is written in parentheses, after the word, without spaces. If there are more than one number in parentheses, they are given without spaces. If the number is at the end of the sentence, the full stop is written after the parentheses.

Also, the list of references must be arranged so that each reference contains the corresponding DOI number, but not other tags and ID numbers that the database assigns to the article.

References style should follow the NLM standards summarized in the International Committee of Medical Journal Editors (ICMJE) Recommendations for the Conduct, Reporting, Editing and Publication of Scholarly Work in Medical Journals: Sample References, available at the webpage:

References to papers accepted but not yet published should be designated a *in press* and in case of e-publication ahead of print, the author should provide DOI.
